Isabel's South of the Border Mexican Restaurant is a bright spot on a wide-open landscape. You're driving down Interstate 10 , taking in the scenery, when you realize that it's lunch time. Pull over into Willcox. The shrimp tacos are cooked just right, with a slice of avocado, cheese, lettuce and tomato. The beans have a fresh, roasted flavor and the thin tortillas are handmade in Mexico. The green-chile pork burrito is spicy, tangy and melt-in-your-mouth tender.
